




LET'S MAKE: LIBERTY CROWN!


1. **Cut** around the inside circle of a paper plate.



2. **Cut** off the bottom of the outer circle to make a crown.




3. **Draw** lines to divide the leftover circle into 8 pieces and cut them out.



4. **Glue** 7 of the triangles to the crown, to match the statue's seven rays.



5. **Color** the crown with crayons.
