Soon their neighbors arrived. Brian's friend Zed bought a flag for his tree house for one dellar. Amelia's taseber bought a tay


dollar. Amelia's teacher bought a toy car tire for twenty-five cents.

In the end, they agreed to give the money to Tinker Town's animal shelter. When they went to the shelter with their donation, Amelia and Brian got to play with all the animals!

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


A, E, I, O, and U are vowels. Circle the vowels.

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
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Write each missing uppercase letter.

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LET'S MAKE: ALPHABET GAME!

 Cut drinking straws into pieces about the length of your thumb. Make 26 pieces.



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2. Flatten one straw piece and write the letter A on it with a permanent marker. Write the letter B on another piece. Keep going until you've written the entire alphabet.

- 3. Thread the straws onto a piece of string in alphabetical order, starting with A.
- **4.** When all 26 are on, **cut** the string and tie the ends into a knot to make a loop. XXMAAL

5. Starting with A, find an object in your home that starts with that letter: like an apple or your ankle! Then **slide** to the next letter on the string: B. Find an object in your home that starts with every letter of the alphabet! How many rounds can you complete without repeating objects?
