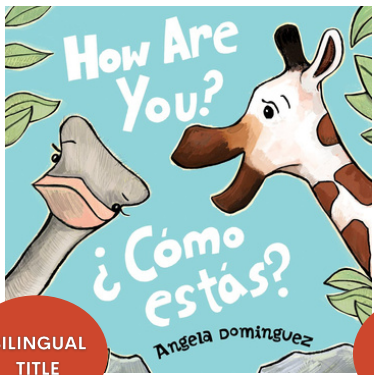


Meet the Author

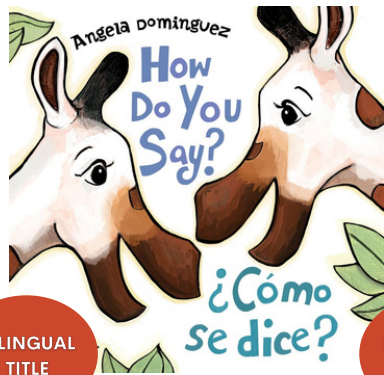

Meet Adrianna Cuevas



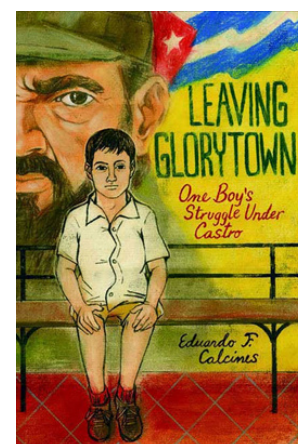
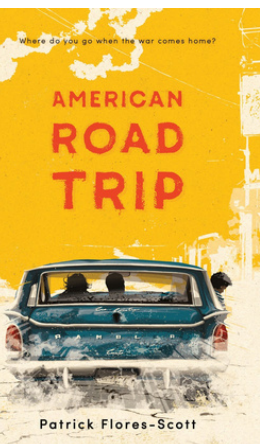
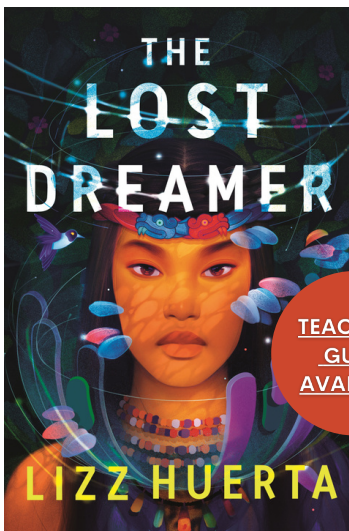
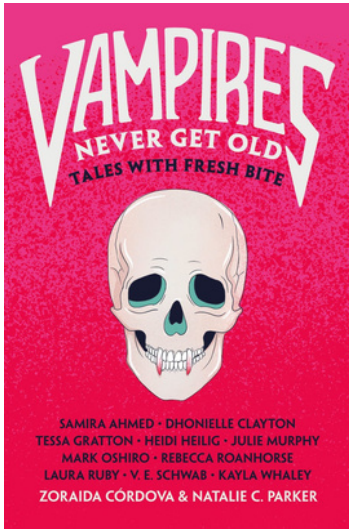

Meet the author



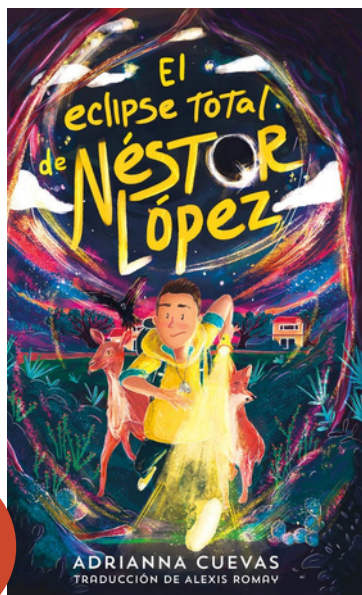

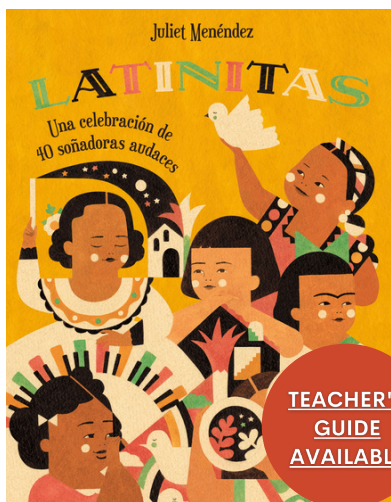
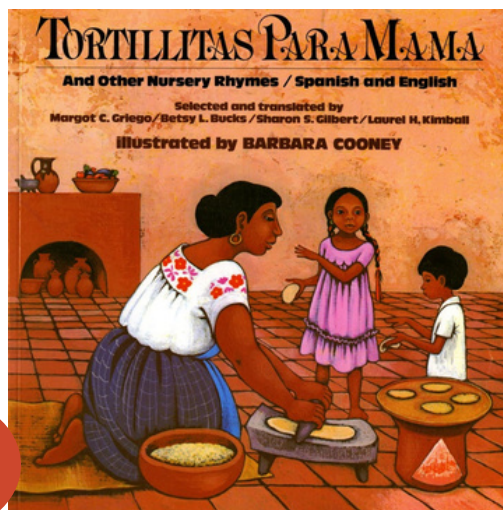
