MADELEINE L'ENGLE

MADELEINE L'ENGLE (1918-2007) was the Newbery Medal-winning author of more than 60 books, including the much-loved Time Quintet. Born in 1918, L'Engle grew up in New York City, Switzerland, South Carolina, and Massachusetts. Her science fantasy classic *A Wrinkle in Time* was awarded the 1963 Newbery Medal. Two companion novels, *A Wind in the Door* and *A Swiftly Tilting Planet* (a Newbery Honor Book), complete what has come to be known as The Time Trilogy, a series that continues to grow in popularity with a new generation of readers. Her 1980 book *A Ring of Endless Light* won the Newbery Honor. L'Engle passed away in 2007 in Litchfield, Connecticut.

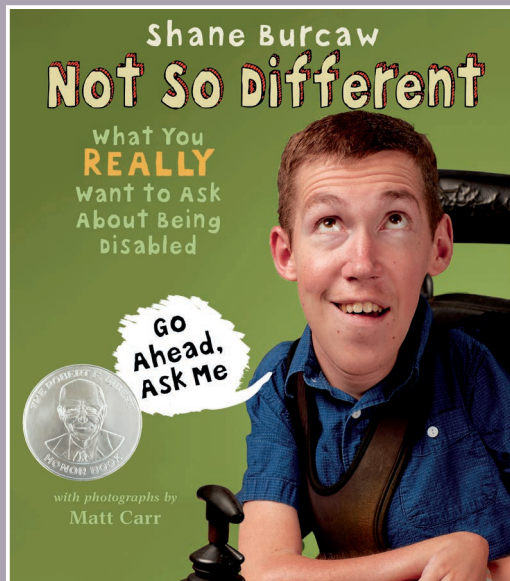

GENE LUEN YANG writes, and sometimes draws, comic books and graphic novels. *American Born Chinese*, his first graphic novel from First Second Books, was a National Book Award finalist, as well as the winner of the Printz Award and an Eisner Award. His two-volume graphic novel *Boxers & Saints* won the *Los Angeles Times* Book Prize and was a National Book Award finalist. His other works include the Secret Coders series (with Mike Holmes), *The Shadow Hero* (with Sonny Liew), New Super-Man from DC Comics (with various artists), the Avatar: The Last Airbender series from Dark Horse Comics (with Gurihiru) and his newest graphic novel, *Dragon Hoops*. He was the fifth National Ambassador for Young People's Literature and in 2016 he was named a MacArthur Foundation Fellow.
