




## The The Coretta Scott King Book Awards Winners and Honor Books




Moth has lost her family in an accident. Though she lives with her aunt, she feels alone and uprooted.



Moth and Sani take a road trip that has them chasing ghosts and searching for ancestors. The way each moves forward is surprising, powerful, and unforgettable.


















































# Meet Mariama J. Lockington
