This guide was designed for kindergarten through third grade but can also be adapted for older students. It is in black and white for easy printing and potential coloring pages.

LET'S GET CRITICAL (THE GOOD KIND)

REMEMBER

- Recall: Who was the main character of the story?
- Identify: What are three things he did to try to get out of his situation?
- **Describe:** What were some of the challenges he experienced during the story?

UNDERSTAND

- Compare and contrast: Illustrators often use the end papers as a tool to show a change in the story. As you compare the first end papers with the last end papers, what do you think changed for Bertie?
- POV: From what point of view is this story told? Why do you think the author chose to tell it that way?

APPLY

- Rethink: If you were in a similar situation to Bertie, what would you do?
- Organize: What questions would you ask the author-illustrator about this book?

ANALYZE

- Examine: How could you tell Bertie was about to have an accident before it happened?
- Infer: Why do you think the illustrator chose laundry for the back cover?

EVALUATE

Debate: Is there a right way to pee your pants?


CREATE SOME SILLY SCENARIOS

CREATE A DISTRACTION

Bertie used a food fight to distract people from seeing his pants. Draw another silly distraction he could have used instead.

FIND SOME CLEAN CLOTHES

When Bertie didn't have any clean clothes, he made his own pants using silly objects like a traffic cone or a globe. Draw three other silly objects that would make great pants.





AN EXTRATERRESTRIAL CHAT




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In the book, Bertie travels to outer space to talk to an alien. Fill in the speech bubbles with what you think they said.






Bertie is on a mission. Can you help him get to where he is going?




COLOR THE MATH

Horizontal stripes on the pants


Then vertical ones

The author-illustrator's own memories inspired this story. Your memories can inspire stories too.




