
ABOUT THE BOOK

Praised as "a story of perserverance and love" in a starred review by *Kirkus Reviews*, here is a story about keeping dreams alive.

Onyx lives with his mother, who is showing signs of early-onset dementia. He doesn't want to bring attention to his home—if Child Protective Services finds out, they'll put him into foster care.

As he's trying to keep his life together, the Civil Rights Movement is accelerating. Is there anywhere that's safe for a young Black boy? Maybe, if only Onyx can fulfill his dream of becoming an astronaut and exploring space, where none of these challenges will follow him. In the meantime, Onyx can dream. And try to get his mom the help she needs.

Based on her own father's story of growing up in the 1960s and facing the same challenge with his own mother, award winner Amber McBride delivers another affecting depiction of being young and Black in America.

AMBER MCBRIDE estimates she reads about 100 books a year. Her work has been published in literary magazines including Ploughshares and Provincetown Arts. Her debut young adult novel, *Me* (*Moth*) was a finalist for the National Book Award, and won the 2022 Coretta Scott King/John Steptoe Award for New Talent, among many other accolades. She is a professor of creative writing at University of Virginia, and lives in Charlottesville, Virgina.


- Brainstorming Discussion Questions: Do you have a nickname, and if so, what is it? How did you get your nickname? Do you like your nickname?

POST-READING RESOURCES AND ACTIVITIES

- Onyx & Beyond Essential Question Exploration
 - Explore the essential question: What are some of the biggest challenges Onyx faces and how does he handle them and overcome them?
 - Visual Representation: Create a drawing or series of drawings which focus on Onyx's challenges and ability to overcome them.
 - Presentation: Create a slide deck which looks at ten to fifteen key moments in the text and Onyx's challenges and ability to overcome them.
 - Poem, Rap, or Song: Create a short poem, rap, or song which highlights Onyx's challenges and ability to overcome them.
 - Music Playlist: Create a playlist of ten to fifteen songs which explore Onyx's challenges and ability to overcome them.





- Textual Evidence Analysis: Identify ten to fifteen key lines in the text which showcase Onyx's challenges and ability to overcome them.
- Analytical Essay: Write a three to five paragraph essay responding to the essential question around Onyx's challenges.
- Narrative Writing Task #1: Create an alternative ending to the book.
- Narrative Writing Task #2: Choose a specific moment in the book and write it from another character's perspective.

• Journal Entry

• Onyx keeps a "super secret" journal where he shares stories, speaks to his relatives, and confesses secrets. Write a "super secret" journal entry to yourself in the same style as Onyx.

Create Your Wings

- Onyx talks about his desire to create wings and fly. The cover of the book also features wings. Draw a set of wings for yourself. On the wings write the following information:
 - A family member who helps you find success.
 - A friend who helps you find success.
 - A dream you have for your future.

• Post-Reading Discussion Questions

- 1. What character did you find the most interesting? Why?
- 2. What character do you think was the most helpful to Onyx? Why?
- 3. What was the most surprising part of the book? Why?
- 4. What challenge did you feel was the most difficult one Onyx faced? Why?
- 5. What did you feel was a worse choice for Onyx: trying to fly or trying to steal the moon rock? Why?
- 6. How do you think you would've handled Onyx's situation?
- 7. What part of the book did you connect to the most? Why?
- 8. What do you think Onyx could've done differently to handle the difficult situations?
- 9. Were you surprised with how the book ended? Why or why not?
- 10. If you were Onyx's friend, what advice would you have given him?
