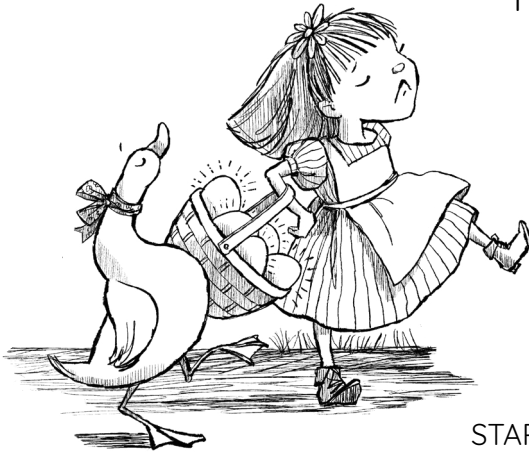
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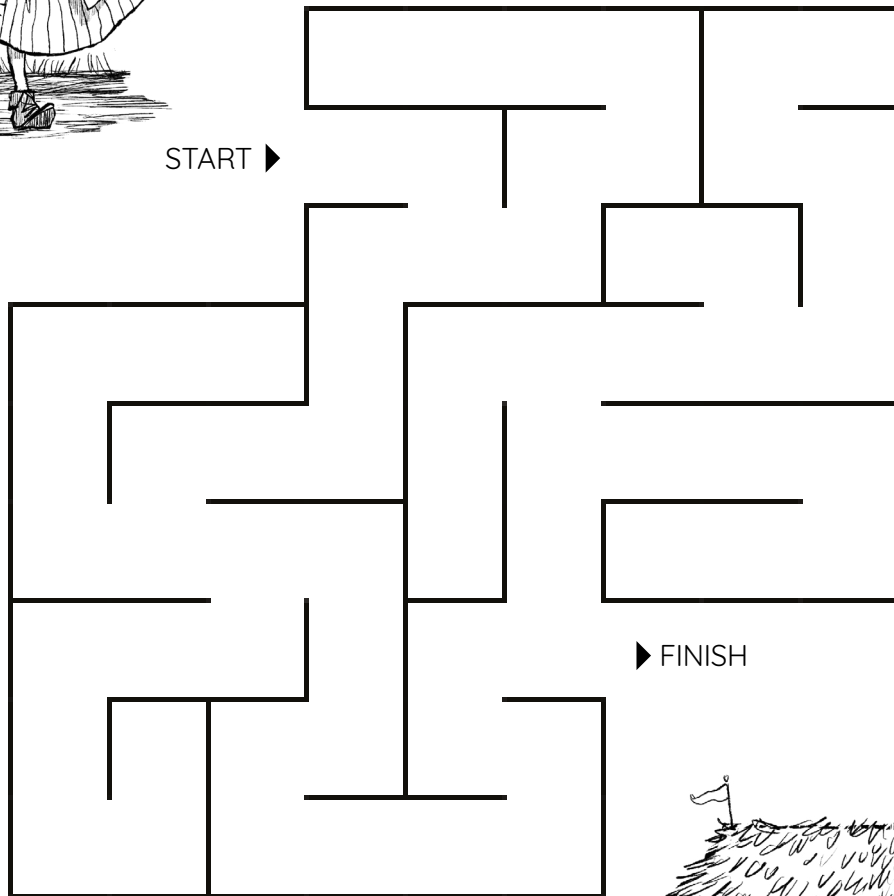


Market Maze: 1

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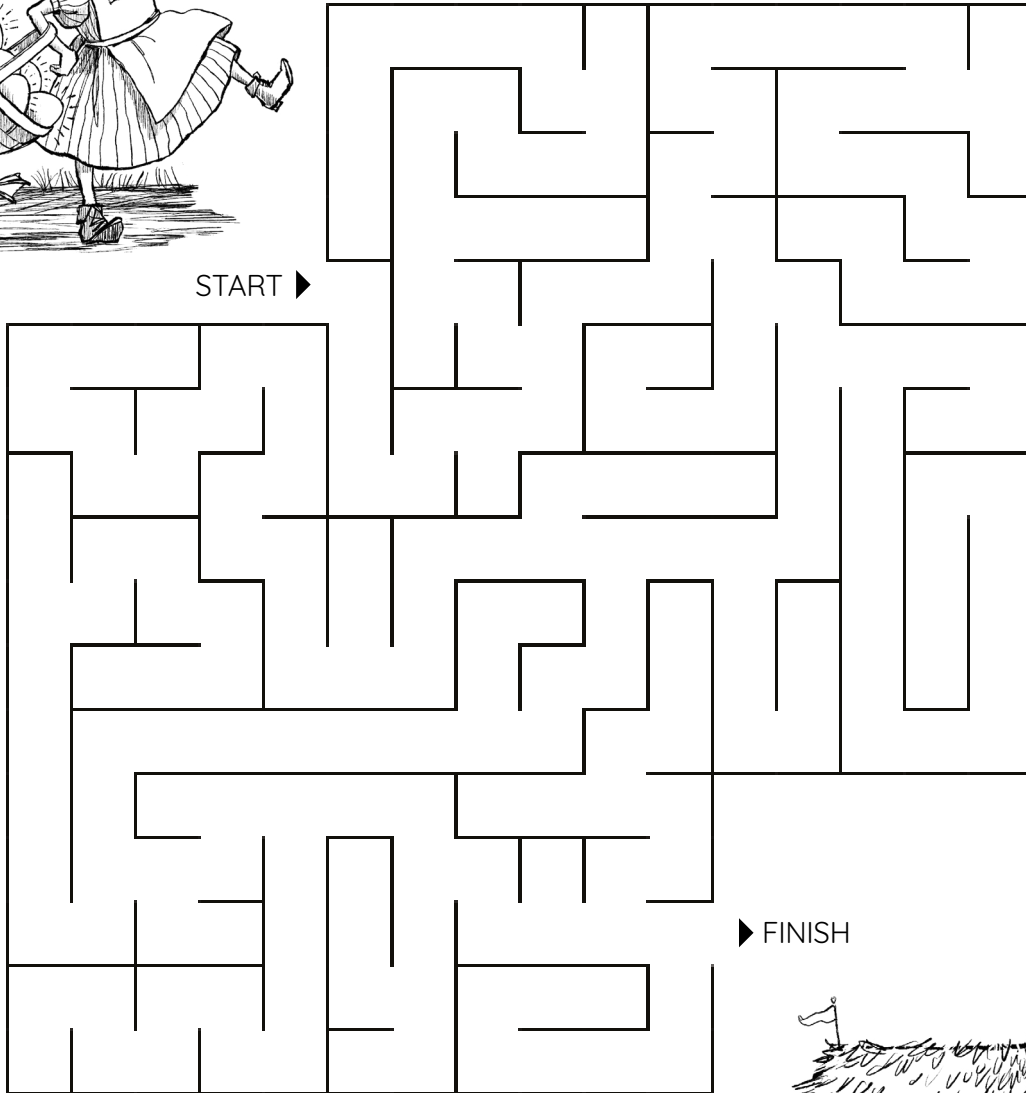

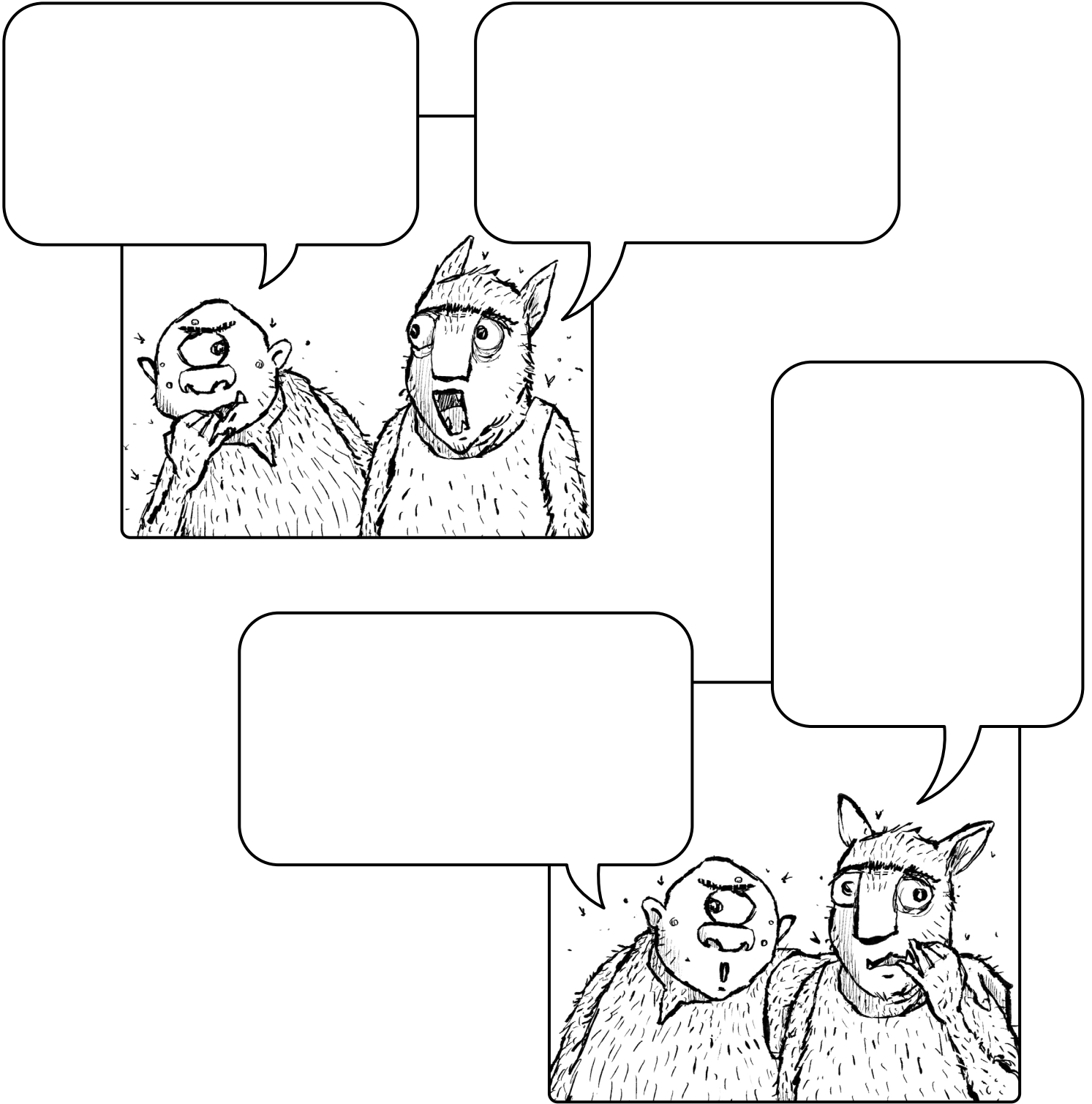

HOW TO BE A PROPER OGRE

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Journal Ideas:

- Would you rather have a magic goose or a golden egg? Explain your choice.
- Has there ever been a time when you felt you were treated different or didn't fit in? What did you do to feel better?
- If you sold your basket of golden eggs for gold coins, what would you buy with your coins and why?
- Write your own fairy tale about an ogre. What is your ogre's name? What does your ogre like to do for fun? Does your ogre have an enemy?
- Write your own "HOW TO BE A PROPER ..." story featuring a character or animal of your choosing other than an ogre.

Other Ideas:

- Take a walk in nature and pretend you're a wildlife photographer. How many animals, insects, and birds do you find?
- As a class, discuss Earth's different ecosystems. What are some interesting facts about swamps?
- Draw your own mythical creature. Does it have any magical powers?
- Build a castle out of plastic bricks, cardboard, or wooden blocks. The tower must include at least one tower and one doorway.
- Go outside and make a pretend "Ogre Salad" in a bucket or a bowl. Include leaves, sticks, grass, rocks, acorns, pinecones, and wildflowers. Make your own pretend salad dressing using sand and water.
